Ivanhoe to welcome web.com

In some ways, PGA Tour's developmental tour is what the real PGA Tour was 20 years ago and more. Begun as the Ben Hogan Tour, and sponsored by that famed equipment company for the first three years, it has evolved into a circuit where, if a corporate boss finds it worthwhile to sponsor a tournament, he can snap his fingers and see it happen.

Certainly, it's more complicated than that, but not nearly as complicated than sponsoring a tournament on the regular tour, where the purses are \$5 million and up and the annual financial committment is often twice that.

Enter the Rust-Oleum Company, headquartered in Vernon Hills, and president and chief operating officer **Tom Reed**.

Enter also the **Ivanhoe Club** in north suburban Mundelein. Reed is a member there.

See where this is headed?

Thought so. Rust-Oleum, itself a throwback name, will sponsor a web.com tournament next June 9-12 – the week before the U.S. Open – at the Ivanhoe Club.

It's a one-year deal with an option for two more, if the club, the company and the circuit find everything to their liking. Rust-Oleum is moving its tournament from Cleveland.

Ivanhoe has 27 holes, and will likely use its original 18, the Forest and Prairie nines, perhaps with a hole or two from the Marsh nine mixed in, for the tournament.

Players on scouting missions last year gave the

course the thumbs up. Some minor bunkering work has already been taken care of, so next spring, all that will need to happen is for the grass to grow for the latespring tournament to look good for the eight hours of coverage Golf Channel will devote to it.

Membership approval came in September. It's the first web.com tournament in Chicago since the LaSalle Bank/Bank of America Open disappeared following the 2008 season. The Western Golf Association sponsors the tour's first playoff tournament annually in Fort Wayne, Ind.

Located on Rt. 60 northwest of the hamlet of Ivanhoe, parking will either be in a nearby big-box store lot or on a nearby farm.

Donald Trump and major golf cannot co-exist

ou can go to any golf course, public or private, in the country and bet good money that there's at least one guy whom the rest of the regulars can't stand.

They put up with him, either because he has a standing tee time or pays his dues on time, but he's the last guy whom you would care to fill out your foursome.

He's the gent for whom the phrase, "Sorry, we already have three," comes to mind.

In the wide world of big-time golf, Donald Trump is that man.

In running for president, he has run various ethnic and religious groups into the ground. Some people have tried to hold their nose, hoping he'd realize that running for president, while a down-and-dirty business from colonial times to today, requires a modicum of tact, decorum, and no small amoint of common sense. That concept has proven impossible for Trump to grasp.

Given his unfounded broad-brush sullying of Hispanics – whom he employs on ground crews and elsewhere at his golf courses – and the Muslim religion, golf groups are finally coming around to the notion that Trump is about the last guy you want to be associated with.

That means not playing at his golf courses. After Trump's slur of Hispanics, the PGA of America canceled its Grand Slam when it couldn't find an alternative to playing this year's exhibition at a Trump course in California.

Now the group has to figure out where to play it in the future. The PGA Tour, the USGA and the R&A are similarly perplexed.

The PGA Tour announced on Dec. 11 it will look into moving the Cadillac Championship – the Doral Open originally – from his Doral in 2017. Apparently the panjandrums of the Tour can't find an alternative site in south Florida on short notice for the soiree coming in March. So why not go to north Florida and the Valley Course at Sawgrass, the one next to the Players Course? Donate the proceeds to the Miami-area charities that would normally benefit.

The USGA has the 2017 U.S. Women's Open slated for Trump Bedminster in New Jersey. What will the kids in the blue jackets do?

Then there's the R&A. Trump's acquisition of the Turnberry Resort in 2014 essentially bought him a place on the British Open rota. The championship has dropped by since 1977, when Tom Watson and Jack Nicklaus staged the "Duel in the Sun," that drama all but assuring the resort additional Opens. And Watson's near-miss in 2009 reminded the new kids what a great player the flinty Missourian had been.

But, changes for the better to the Turnberry layout aside, it's impossible now for the R&A to go back while Trump's presence darkens the entrance.

"2020 will not happen here," an R&A insider told *The Independent on Sunday*. "Turnberry will be back. But perhaps not Trump Turnberry."

The Women's British Open, administered by the Ladies Golf Union, was played there less than a month after Trump first tore into immigration from Mexico in the summer. The LGU was really stuck, and you had to laugh at Trump at telling the LPGA, which doesn't run the tournament, it could leave after LPGA commissioner Mike Whan criticized him.

Donald Trump is Al Czervik in real life. The fictional version is preferred.

A personal note, if you don't mind.

Uneasy lies the Crown

LPGA team tourney, bounced from Rich Harvest, finds refuge at Merit Club

Some things just never happen in golf.

Once a tournament site is fixed, that's it. A club decides to host, and it hosts. There's no turning back.

Until Nov. 11, that is, and the stunning announcement that Rich Harvest Farms, the leafy backyard playground of Jerry Rich, would not be hosting next July's International Crown, the LPGA country-as-team tournament brought to life by Rich himself and sponsored by UL, a firm with deep roots in Chicago.

Wait a minute. Rich, who worked behind the scenes for years convincing the LPGA that the Crown would be as worthwhile to the circuit as the Solheim Cup, turning his back on his baby?

There's more to it than that.

High marks go to the LPGA for quickly arranging an alternate site, Merit Club in Libertyville – itself the creation of a golf visionary in Bert Getz, and the host of the U.S. Women's Open in 2000 – within a fortnight. Merit's acceptance of the Crown was reported on Nov. 23.

Had Merit not been interested, finding a course would have been far harder. Medinah wasn't interested, Olympia Fields is committed to the 2017 Women's PGA Championship, and outing-heavy Cog Hill didn't have the dates (July 21-24) open.

The reasons behind Rich's rejection of his creation on his own course are complicated, but it can

be boiled down to a difference in the vision for the Crown, from marketing to execution.

The LPGA didn't see it as just another week on the calendar, but nor did the group see it as on a par with the Solheim Cup. Rich, whose staging of the 2009 Solheim featured crowds of about 30,000 for three straight days – no regular LPGA tournament held in Chicago had brought in that many spectators for a week – saw it as exactly that.

The 2009 Solheim marketing campaign reached out to both groups in Chicago and the near suburbs and the Naperville-Aurora corridor, by itself larger than any other metro area in the state. The LPGA's marketing person – assigned part-time to the Crown and living out of town – wanted to downplay marketing to Chicago. Sources familiar with the joust note the LPGA's rep was also more interested in

selling sex-appeal than golf.

Rich, knowing where the corporate dollars in Chicago are controlled, and a fan of women's golf because of the golf, saw both ideas as a mistake.

That was the start of the disagreement. The LPGA wasn't thrilled with Rich either, and things finally came to a head in early November, when the two sides agreed to disagree and split.

As a result, Merit Club has about seven months to assemble a group of volunteers, build infrastructure, and host an international team competition.

The LPGA and Rich said for public consumption that they're open to working together in the future. Rich does have an affection for the Crown, but it's impossible to imagine the ladies returning to cavort in his back yard in the foreseeable future given the animus between the two sides.

Three of a kind

Egan, McNair, Sobb inducted before full house

Career achievement.

It's sometimes difficult to quantify, but easy to recognize in retrospect.

It's built not on one achievement, but day by day, a continuing process that often allows the achiever to get lost in the work and not realize the grand scope of the overall accomplishment.

The three inductees to the Illinois Golf Hall of Fame in 2015 fit that general description. While H. Chandler Egan was a champion player – a pair of U.S. Amateur titles and four Western Amateur crowns made his enshrinement an inevitability – he did as much or more without clubs in his hand, focusing on course design in the Pacific Northwest.


Off-course achievement is also true of Leon McNair and Jim Sobb, a pair of Chicago-area professionals with long tenures at their respective

courses, and a record of considerable service out of the shop. And Sobb can also play a little.

Those achievements were the reason a full house gathered in the ballroom of The Glen Club on Oct. 23 to honor the trio of the Class of 2015.

McNair and Sobb were on hand, while Egan was represented by his grandsons, Morris and Chandler Everett, as well as Exmoor Country Club member-historian Don Holton, whose nomination of and passion for Egan's achievements helped convince the committee that a golfer of a century ago should be remembered forever.

In entertaining detail, Holton told the story of Egan's strong connection to Exmoor, then and now – a hallway of the clubhouse is dedicated to club artifacts, and Egan's trophies feature strongly in the display.

The Everetts, sons of Egan's only offspring, a

daughter, offered heartfelt tributes, with Chandler speaking as Egan himself in entertaining fashion, a notion that captivated the audience.

McNair, who discovered golf when he biked over from Lombard and became a caddie at Glen Oak Country Club, has been immersed in the game since. His ambition – driving over to meet fledgling golf course architect and constructor Brent Wadsworth after asking for a job on the phone – led to a lifelong connection, and his long-time posting at Fox Bend Golf Course as the head professional.

Fittingly, in conjunction with his induction, often at-odds state officials agreed to honor Mc-Nair by naming the stretch of Route 34 in front of Fox Bend the Leon McNair Highway, complete with signage. A miniature of the sign was presented to Leon by former state representative


Tom Cross at the ceremony.

The retired pro isn't really retired. His pro bono work for charities is likely what pushed his Hall of Fame nomination over the top, and that continues with Wadsworth's chartity arm.

"The reason we launched Links Across America is, other than a few rare cases, affordable golf for youth does not exist in this country," McNair said in his talk. "The mission was to develop feeder short courses, three-, six- or nine-hole across the country to provide affordable golf, especially for youth, families, adult beginners and individuals with injuries or disabilities.

"I mentioned to Brent that we would fail miserably unless we could get companies from the golf industry to join us. Currently, we have 61 company partners committed to contribute profit, goods or services to assist in building the Links

short courses at a significantly lower cost."

McNair proudly noted that in the first six years, 29 courses have been built in 16 states, with Oakmont and Hazeltine National on track to open public short courses for children on their otherwise-private property soon after hosting the 2016 U.S. Open and Ryder Cup, respectively.

What he didn't mention was that the success of Links Across America is largely due to his persistence.

Sobb recalled asking former Hall of Fame chairman Bill Heald why the legendary pro from Riverside had nominated him several years ago, and Heald's typically blunt answer:

"Because of your commitment to the Ivanhoe Club and its membership, because of your ability to mentor fellow PGA professionals, because of your committee involvement and service to the PGA, because of your slightly above-average playing ability, but most of all, because of your ability to balance your career as a PGA professional and still be the consummate husband and father."

That above-average playing ability places Sobb among the best players in state history. Through 2015, he's won seven state majors, three of them Illinois PGA championships and four Illinois PGA Match Play crowns. Only six players, five of them Hall of Famers, have won more.

In 2011, 16 years after his last Match Play title, he won the Match Play again – the longest stretch between titles in any Illinois major – and also the Senior Match Play. Nobody else has won both championships in the same year.

In fact, he's a three-time Senior Match Play winner, and repeating in winning the Senior PGA Section title this year brings his total in that championship to four. Small wonder, then, that he's been the senior player of the year on five occasions.

That alone would have made his selection by the Hall's selection committee a snap, but there was more, as Heald mentioned in his explanation to Sobb.

The real wonder, as in the case of McNair, was not so much in how he did everything so well, but how he found time to do so much of it.

The nomination window for the Class of 2017 – the 17th to be inducted – opened with the close of the ceremony. It remains open through 2016. Information on how to nominate a candidate for consideration is at www.illinoisgolfhof.org/nomination.aspx

The best Day in golf

Or, how to get to No. 1 by winning everything in sight

At one point in the final round of the BMW Championship at Conway Farms Golf Club, Jason Day's lead was down to a mere four strokes.

He had been saturating his scorecard with pars, with the exception of a birdie at the eighth hole and a bogey at the ninth.

Daniel Berger was nipping at his heels, or at least trying to.

A rookie, chase down the guy who had won three of his previous five starts? Who had raced out to a six-stroke lead after 54 holes? Who was dominating the way guys like Hagen and Woods had done in Western Opens past?

Say it ain't so.

It ain't. Day sank a 15-footer from the fringe for birdie on the par-4 16th and a 3-footer for a birdie 4 at the last to win going away and grab the No. 1 world ranking away from Rory McIlroy, who finished tied for fourth.

Day's winning score of 22-under-par 262, capped by his 2-under 69 on Sunday, Sept. 20, beat runner-up Berger by six strokes, third-place Scott

Piercy – who birdied four of the last five holes – by seven and McIlroy, Rickie Fowler and John "J.B." Holmes by eight.

Day's total tied the Western Open mark set by Tiger Woods at Cog Hill in 2007. It was the biggest rout in a Western / BMW since Woods won by eight at Cog Hill in 2009.

It seemed inevitable entering the day, and proved to be so, but that deterred neither the galleries from pouring in nor the players was pouring in birdies. Bubba Watson went out in 29 and was chasing 59 before a bogey bit him. He settled for 65. There were two 64s, and more red numbers on the board than a supermarket sale.

All that was fun. What Day accomplished was remarkable.

At the British Open, Day missed the playoff by a stroke. He returned to North America and won the Canadian Open the next week, then outdueled Jordan Spieth to capture the PGA Championship at Whistling Straits, then won the Barclays, the first of the PGA Tour's playoff series. The BMW is annually the third of the four playoff dances.

By winning it, he triumphed four times in his six starts, and made the strongest possible argument that he, rather than Masters and U.S. Open winner Spieth, should be considered the player of the year.

(Spieth answered back the following week with a victory in the Tour Championship at East Lake, thus snagging the \$10 million proffered by FedEx as well, and everyone's player of the year honors.)

Regardless, Day was the man to catch on Sunday, and uncatchable.

"This week was a whirlwind," Day said. "How I started the week, and the last two days were very emotional for me. Very hard to sleep at night, knowing I had the chance to get to No. 1."

That was his goal, announced to the world at 18, but in his heart since he took up golf as a release from a difficult homelife in Australia at 13. He'd been on the verge of greatness, and was in the chase for the U.S. Open at Chambers Bay when a spell of vertigo dropped him to the turf late in his

second round. Like a fighter, he rallied and was able to tie for the lead after 54 holes. He finished tied for ninth, five strokes behind Spieth, but the spark was there, burned brightly at St. Andrews, and has been blinding since.

"I always had a vision of standing on top of the earth when I was a kid," Day said. "It feels really good right now."

How good?

"I'm still a regular guy who's really good at hitting a golf ball," Day said. "I feel like I did yesterday."

Only with a better view.

Par merely a rumor at Conway Farms

One playing of the tournament at Conway Farms exposed the course as a pushover for the pros. The second playing, after it was toughened, provided more evidence that, as a championship course, it's perfectly situated to attract moneyed galleries and position luxury suites for them.

A championship test, it is not. The numbers:

- The field scored 130 of 276 rounds under par (47.1 percent).
- There were 26 rounds of 65 or better, led by Jason Day's opening-round 61.
- Day's opening two rounds of 61-63–124 was a record for any 36-hole combination, and seven strokes better than the previous opening 36, the 131 set by Camilo Villegas at Bellerive in 2008.
- While it was played in "lift, clean and place" conditions, ordered by the PGA Tour because of an overnight downpour, the second-round average on the par-71 layout was still a puny 67.928, more than 3 strokes under par. It was the lowest average of the 438 rounds in Western Open / BMW history, breaking the mark of 68.697 in the final round last year at altitude at Cherry Hills near Denver.
 - The four-round average of 69.489 trailed only

the rainswept 2008 edition (69.370) at Bellerive, where no round averaged 70 or higher.

Against all that should be considered the goal of the Western Golf Association, which means the BMW is, as Charles Bartlett noted long ago in the heart of the Western Open era, "the championship with a cause."

All the luxury boxes and corporate suites dotting the landscape at Conway Farms means the WGA should clear \$2 million for the Evans Scholars Foundation when the final bill is paid. And the tournament does even better when it goes out of town, hence the year-here, year-there schedule implemented this decade.

Pettersen prevails in IHSA championship

Walk into a golf dome, and you should be greeted with the tune sung by Dean Martin: "Baby, it's cold outside."

Inside, it's no worse than cool, and sometimes toasty if you set up close to one of the heaters. But the lure, more than warmth, is the game.

Curiously, given the cacphony to be found in a golf dome, it's among the places where the game can be found in its purest state.

The object of the game is hitting the ball, pure and simple. In a dome, there is, beyond sipping on a drink, nothing else to do but hit the ball.

The scenery is non-existent. The wind isn't a factor. No trees are in the shot. There's no concern about anything but the club in one's hand, the ball, and the target.

The Chicago area is populated by eight domes, ranging from the oldest, at White Pines Golf Course in Bensenville, to perhaps the most lavish, at McQ's in Romeoville.

They're as far north as Highland Park, as far west as Aurora, as far south as south of Frankfort. Most of them cater to golfers all the time, but a handful reserve evenings for softball or soccer – see the Illinois Golfer guide on the following page for details.

The only underserved area is the city of Chicago itself, but not for lack of trying. Those with good memories will remember a golf dome south of the Loop on Roosevelt Rd. some 25 years ago. That facility was popular until it was hit and flattened by a winter windstorm. The owners never rebuilt.

One of the customers was Mike Munro, a downtown office worker and golf nut who decided he could make a go of a similar facility. He and some partners convinced the White Pines Park District to lease them their driving range in the winter and proceeded to put up a dome.

There's been one there ever since. Munro eventually bought out his partners, running the operation himself until selling to KemperSports before the 2014-15 indoor season.

The domes are surprisingly weather-dependent when it comes to patronage. Logic would say that any kind of cold will send a golfer indoors to practice, but that's not the case.

Weather in the 50s, as we've often had this late autumn, keeps golfers outside and on those many courses that remain open all year. Into the 40s, and players start to come through the revolving doors that keep the air pressure up. Into the 30s, and business really picks up.

Only really severe cold or a snowstorm can slow the pace of business then, Munro found through years of experience.

With the exception of some late-night activities – even a high school football player practicing his punting prior to going to college – White Pines has been an all-golf dome. Quite a few others mix golf with other sports. The domes in Bridgeview and Highland Park relegate golf to weekday afternoons, which only increases the clientele at adjacent domes.

McQ's in Bolingbrook did the same when it was called Ditka's Sports Dome, but owner Jim McWethy, he of Mistwood Golf Course fame, has trimmed the softball leagues to Thursday and Friday nights, putting golf into the lead slot the other five nights of the week.

Domes, sweet domes

Bridgeview Sports Dome 8900 S. 77th Ave., Bridgeview (708) 924-8290

An all-golf dome at first, the focus has shifted to sports like softball played under roof more than golf. It's the one you see on the east side of the Tri-State Tollway. Take the 95th St. exit and go north on Harlem, then west on 87th St., south on 78th Ave., east on 88th St. and south on 77th Ave. to the end of the road.

Buffalo Grove Sports Center 801 McHenry Rd., Buffalo Grove (847) 353-7575

A chipping green with a pair of bunkers is the highlight, which includes an upper-deck for hitting (32 stations, 16 high and 16 low) and a full-service pro shop. Over 28,000 people hit balls there last winter.

Green Garden Golf Dome 9511 W. Monee-Manhattan Rd., Frankfort (815) 469-3350

Built in part because a previous owner's son needed a place to practice in the summer, the Green Garden dome is big (42 stations on two levels) and bright, including a chipping area and a putting green.

Highland Park Field House 2205 Skokie Valley Rd., Highland Park (847) 433-3422

A 52,000-square foot facility generally limiting golf practice to weekday mornings and early afternoons (Thursday until 6:30 p.m.). Holiday week hours are later. Otherwise, it caters to soccer players.

Links & Tees 900 W. Lake St., Addison (630) 458-2660

One of the bigger domes, with 45 stations (22 upstairs) looking at a field featuring a quintet of target greens along with the usual hanging targets. Putting and chipping greens round out the offering.

McQ's Sports Dome 730 N. Bolingbrook Dr., Bolingbrook (630) 739-7600 The elaborate McQ's includes a 60,000-square foot heated dome, with a bunker and putting greens

along with an adjoining restaurant and off-track betting center. Softball rules on Thursday and Friday nights.

The Golf Practice 1456 Old Deerfield Rd., Highland Park (847) 850-0956

Not a dome but a full-service practice center covering 7,000 square feet, The Golf Practice, previously Green to Tee, features landscaped artificial turf, including greens, combined with golf simulators.

Sports Zone 1900 Hill Ave., Aurora (630) 820-8624

There's something for everyone year-round, but indoor golf is the main focus in the winter. Rare in that you pay by the bucket rather than by time. Just north of the US 30-US 34 intersection.

White Pines Golf Dome 500 W. Jefferson St., Bensenville (630) 422-1060
The gold standard for size – nearly 100 yards to the far wall – and scope, with 48 stations, 15 upstairs, plus a putting green and top-notch golf simulator. Open until early May.

AROUND ILLINOIS Mistwood's clubhouse opens

Final piece of owner Jim McWethy's grand puzzle is in place

Jim McWethy can finally sit down to lunch in his own clubhouse.

For the last year, he's looked at a construction site – and bills for same – each time he's come to his Mistwood Golf Course in Romeoville. His dream of a clubhouse to match his golf course has finally become reality.

Gone is the bizarre building with the pro shop on the second floor and a snack shop on the first floor and dining room on the second floor. Gone is the architectural nightmare that everyone playing the third hole got a long look at.

In its place is a bold statement, dressed as an Irish mansion in the same style as the learning center that was built two yearrs ago, to accompany the remodeling of the golf course.

To the left is a photo of the main dining room – a.k.a. McWethy's Tavern – one with a view of the aforementioned third hole. The view from back in the fairway is no longer of an eyesore, but of an inviting place, one where one will be tempted to linger in, not escape.

McWethy poured \$6 million into the renovation of the golf course. He may have spent more on the new clubhouse, which features not only the dining room, but an adjacent banquet room, as well as a full-line pro shop, offices for his growing mar-

keting department, and an underground cart storage facility, one more thing the old building was lacking.

It's really three buildings in one. The pro shop – finally at ground level – and marketing office upstairs is on the west side, appearing to be separate from the rest of the clubhouse. In fact, it's connected by the cart storage underground. The bulk of the building is to the east.

Mickelson captures PGA Assistant Pro

Andy Mickelson never doubted his return to Mistwood this year would pay off.

But by winning the 39th PGA Assistant Championship in Port St. Lucie, Fla.? That might have been a stretch.

"I was working in a cubicle," he said of his previous post at a packaging company after his two-stroke victory over Adam Rainaud of South Hadley, Mass. "Then I got the call."

It was Mistwood. He was lured to return.

A good showing in the Illinois PGA Assistant Championship earned him a spot in the national field at PGA Golf Club. He made the most of it, scoring 16-under-par 272 to beat Rainaud and the rest of the finals.

Not looking ahead helped, he said. "Shot to shot. I just wanted to make it to the weekend. That was my goal. I had a good year in our Section, but there was no way I saw myself winning. No way was I going to go 16 under for four days. I have not played a big four-round tournament in nearly 10 years.


"It is just surreal. I am having trouble fathoming this, to be honest. All week, I was in the mindset of 'shot-to-shot.' I did not get ahead of myself. I just kept my head down," he told PGA.com.

Mickelson – pronounced Michaelson, incidentally – scored 68-65-68-71 on the Wanamaker Course to collect the title and \$9,000. He birdied three of the last six holes, including a curling 15-footer on the 12th, to regain the lead from Rainaud, whose putter betrayed him, and cantered home a champion.

Player's night raises \$800,000 for Evans Scholars Foundation

As galas go, the Western Golf Association's rank as high as rankings go in the world of golf. Since the Green Coat Gala was created in 2011, close to \$3 million has been raised for the Evans Scholars Foundation by donors in the audience to hear Curtis Strange, Tom Watson, Jack Nicklaus, Lee Tre-

vino, and this year's special guest, Gary Player.

The Oct. 16 soiree at the Peninsula Hotel downtown raised about \$800,000 for the caddies-to-college fund, the largest total of the five years.

Player was his usual outspoken self when it came to golf's continuing emphasis on distance and its long-term effect on the game.

"I think the golf ball and golf architecture has hurt the game tremendously. Rounds of golf amongst the amateurs is down considerably. And the most important part of golf is not professional golf, it's the amateurs, the man in the street. They're making the golf courses so long and so tough. Bunkers in front of the green, asking a lady member to hit over the bunker and stop the ball, which she's not capable of doing.

"And the golf ball is the reason of this because the golf ball is going so far. If we look at the Tour in 30 to 40 to 50 years time, 50 percent of the Tour will hit the ball 400 yards. What's going to happen to golf? It's going to be obsolete.

"They should cut the ball (in) professional golf down by 50 yards, let the amateurs use what they like. They won't recognize that there are two different games between professional and amateur and they are as different as night and day.

"And so we've got to stop this because if you take Augusta, which was one of the longest golf courses, and I'm quite embarrassed because I've said, "one thing about Augusta, they can't make it any longer, they can't go back into the streets." Well I say this with tongue in cheek, I just heard they bought the highways around the golf course and putting the tees back. So they're not being the best example for golf."

Player does not kid. Augusta National, having bought all the property west of Berckman's Road, which runs along the front nine, is moving the road

both to refurbish the parking lot it created, and to allow for lengthening of at least the fifth hole.

He added that the USGA and R&A, plus the PGA of America and PGA Tour, didn't want to touch distance, fearing lawsuits.

"They are working diligently and doing the best to their ability, but they're scared to cut the ball back," Player said. "You know, America is very much of a litigious society, and instead of leading with strength and saying, look, we're going to cut the ball back ... they're going to have to. Because you haven't had a LeBron James, a Michael Jordan, ever play golf. And they're coming.

"Because golf, all these super strong athletes, which we have never seen in golf as of yet are saying, 'Listen, these guys are making more.' I make more money at 80 then when I was world champion. Now, what other sport can you do that?

"So these guys are saying, 'What am I playing all these contact sports for when I can have a sport that I can go on forever and ever.' There's going to be some mighty big changes take place in golf. Did you think, and did anybody think you would ever see people play at Augusta – Dustin Johnson – and hit a wedge to the par 5 13th, and a 9 iron over the green at 15 so you should've hit a wedge. Now when you get the LeBron James' coming out, they're going to hit wedges to every par 5."

And there you have it.
