## WWGA, WGA now partners

It's official. The Women's Western Golf Association and Western Golf Association have entered into a partnership for both running the Women's Western Amateur and Women's Western Junior and the WW-GA's scholarship program through the Women's Western Golf Foundation.

Initially slated to begin Aug. 1, 2017, the co-op agreement was pushed back a year because the WWGA had already locked up a tournament site. Now, that's going to be the WGA's task. Already, Royal Melbourne in Long Grove has been announced as next year's Women's Western Amateur site. The course has hosted the Illinois Open in the past.

"We're thrilled to be bringing the Women's Western Amateur to Royal Melbourne," WGA senior tournament VP **Vince Pellegrino** said. "These are the most talented amateur women in the game, and we look forward to seeing them challenge themselves on one of the toughest courses in the Chicago area."

The KemperSports course was designed by **Ted Robinson, Greg Norman** and **Bob Spence**.

"It is an honor for us to host the best women's amateurs from around the country at one of our flagship properties," KemperSports president Josh Lesnik said.

The 119th Women's Western Am is slated for July 15-20, and open to players with a USGA Handicap of 5.4 or less. The 120-player field is cut to the low 32 after 36 holes of stroke play. That gives it a unique for-

mat from the Western Amateur, which uses 72 holes of stroke play to eliminate all but 16 from a field of 156.

The five-year pact brings together groups which had split in 1903, two years after the WGA started a women's amateur championship. The ladies of the day thought they could run it better and started the WWGA, which is two years younger than their signature championship. In 2012, the WGA began to give administrative support to the WWGA for tournament operations.

Now, with the all-volunteer WWGA, once populated by housewives, finding fewer women willing to give up a week from work to run golf tournaments, the WGA has agreed to staff tournaments, bringing a mixture of green (WGA) and blue (WWGA) coats together.

It should give a boost to the Women's Western Am, the second-oldest women's amateur in the country behind the U.S. Women's Amateur. Its history of notable champions, includes, in 2013, **Ariya Jutanugarn**.

HE'S ACES: There's never a bad time to make your first hole-in-one. Pete Karambelas will tell you that. Fit as anybody 30 years younger at age 93, Pete is the man to beat at Sun City in Huntley, whether playing softball, pickle ball or golf. But he'd never made an ace until Aug. 13, when, playing with pals, including a cousin, he took on the fifth hole at Prairie Isle and made a 1. A Cobra 7-wood and a smooth swing enabled him to negotiate the 130-yard hole – over water, no less – in a single stroke. As his son Bill said, "I guess that's why you never stop playing!"

## The Grill Room by Tim Cronin

## There's room for fun in this crazy game

here is always something to complain or argue about in golf, whether it's Phil Mickelson losing his mind at the U.S. Open or the inability of the United States Golf Association and R&A to regulate distance, so fearful are they of lawsuits from equipment manufacturers.

At times, it seems the grumpy outnumber the satisfied. The appearance is that golf is turning into sports talk radio, where even a winning team can do little right.

Appearances deceive. To quote Chip Beck, "Golf is good."

The game is fun, if infuriating at times for fine and baffled players alike. The business of the game is slowly improving, though it's hard to tell at times from the number of courses for sale.

The quality of play is ridiculously high. Forget for a moment the distance the youngsters of today slam the ball. The cadre that attacked Sunset Ridge in the Western Amateur reduced a course that was a major-league park in 1972, when only 14 players broke par for 72 holes in the Western Open, to a Double-A operation this time around, chiefly thanks to the triple whammy of better agronomy, phenomenally better equipment (see paragraph 1) and the technical teaching resulting in perfect swings.

It might make a mockery of scoring and cause record books to be revised on a monthly basis, but it's great fun to watch. Cole Hammer's thin as a rail, but he hits the ball into the next county, and Tim Cronin / Illinois Golfe

in the right direction. There's nothing not to like about that.

Atmospherics mean something as well. That became evident at Chicago Golf Club before and during the first round of the Inaugural U.S. Senior Women's Open. A bit of it was hokey – ceremonially depositing items into a box not for a time capsule, but for the USGA Museum? – but raising the group's gonfalon up the flagpole, a stirring rendition of "The Star Spangled Banner," and finally the hardly-ceremonial first tee shot by JoAnne Carner, winner of most USGA titles than anyone (and matched only by Tiger Woods) hit every mark on the How To Inaugurate A Championship card.

Plus, Carner split the fairway and shot her age -79 – on the first day.

Just strolling about Chicago Golf Club is a golfer's version of walking on air, but one need not necessarily be there to feel good about playing or watching the game. Way out in Silvis the same week, TPC Deere Run hosted the John Deere Classic for the 20th time, and the galleries got a kick out of the play, enjoyed Whitey's Ice Cream – a delicacy that Quad Citians enjoy year-round – and made the centerpiece of the Deere equipment display, the now-traditional giant golf ball backed by a driver powered by a mammoth Deere excavator, the selfie capital of the Midwest.

Fun. There ought to be more of it in golf.





## Texas-bound teen sets course record, shares stroke-play medal, survives two extra-hole matches to triumph at Sunset Ridge

f Cole Hammer wants to take up another sport, he might consider running the marathon.

If he does bet on him Hammer an 18 year old perpetual more

If he does, bet on him. Hammer, an 18-year-old perpetual motion machine, played 76 holes in match play on Friday and Saturday, and survived all four matches.

Two of them went to the 20th hole. Another turned on his opponent's drive landing in a divot when Hammer was two down with ve holes remaining. Before that, he'd run the table in stroke-play qualifying, his 23-under-par 261 – which Sam Stevens stunningly matched – turning Sunset Ridge Country Club's scorecard upside down.

His Western Amateur championship match with Davis Riley at Sunset Ridge on Saturday, August 4, appeared for a time to be a rout. Hammer was 4-up at the turn. Then Riley rallied, cutting the gap to 1-up after his birdie on the par-5 16th, even though he questioned the pin placement.

Riley could get no closer, halving the last two holes to make Hammer the 1-up champion.

Hammer isn't the youngest to win, nor did he dominate, as the two 20-hole wins will attest, but he may have the most complete game at 18 since Tiger Woods. He's as long as he needs to be, has full and half-wedges at his command, and, most important, rolled in almost every putt he needed to across ve days as co-medalist and champion.

"Surreal," Hammer said. "This is the biggest day in my golf career without question. Nothing even compares. Individually this by far is the biggest tournament I've ever won, and to do it here at Sunset Ridge with my mom on the bag, it really means the world."

Hammer had already been part of the winning team in the U.S. Amateur Four-Ball this spring, but team golf is one thing and doing it yourself is quite another. This one was all his, from his 261 in stroke play to

knocking off four straight foes in match play.

"I knew he had game," said Riley, a 21-yearold entering his senior year at Alabama. "He said he'd admired me since he was 10, and now he just beat me."

On the rst nine, it appeared the feat would be easy. As the mercury climbed to 98 degrees, Riley seemed to be melting away faster than an ice cream sandwich. Hammer won the third hole with a birdie after a wedge to two feet, won the sixth with a birdie after a wedge to a foot, won the seventh with an eagle by draining a cross-green two-tier 60-footer, and rolled in a mere 20-footer on greens Stimping close to 13 to win the ninth hole.

"I just kept telling myself I was playing great," Hammer said.

Four-up at the turn. Riley would have been excused for sneaking into the clubhouse at that point and jumping into a waiting car at the front door, but he saw hope in the middle of the muddle.

"I didn't really have much doubt," Riley said of his comeback hopes. "I had faith in what I was doing. I'd played the back as good as anybody all week, so if I stayed patient, I knew I was good enough to make a charge."

He did. Riley got up and down for par on the par-4 11th while Hammer three-putted from eight feet above the hole, cutting the gap to three holes. Nearly driving the 12th green and chipping to six feet earned him a birdie and second straight hole, narrowing the margin to two holes.

"Me and my caddie were talking all round, we never felt out of it, even 4-down," Riley said. "After 11, it was 'Let's do this.' I thought the momentum was with me 100 percent.

"I hit some good shots and made some good birdies and gave myself a chance, considering I was 4-down at the turn."

Hammer called a birdie putt to halve the 13th "a huge momentum putt," and he used that momentum to win the 14th with a par, but Riley came back with a birdie 2 on the 15th after dropping his tee shot six feet from the cup. It was a two-hole margin again, and only 1-up in Hammer's favor after Riley's birdie on No. 16.

That rattled Hammer.

"He buried that 12-footer up the hill and it was not an easy putt," Hammer said. "I would have been 2-up with two to go. Then he hit a great

shot into 17. It was tough to see, but I stepped up and hit a great shot too."

The match was loaded with great shots, and was clearly tense by the 17th, when short putts that would usually have been conceded were not. Riley had a chance to square the match but couldn't sink a sliding downhill 10-footer for birdie. Hammer had already missed his 15-foot birdie attempt. Each player made a two-foot kneeknocker to take the match to the last, where both players bounced their ip-wedges off the rockhard green into the collar (Hammer a bit farther), and could only make par. For Hammer, that was enough for the title, the rst one he's won with



mom Allison on the bag. (Sorry, Mom, but he's hired a local caddie who knows Pebble Beach's greens for the forthcoming U.S. Amateur.)

"I'm excited to come back as the defending champion," Hammer said of 2019, when the Western Am returns to longtime home Point O' Woods. "It sounds cool."

Hammer is the sixth Texas Longhorn to win the title, joining Rik Massengale, Ben Crenshaw, Justin Leonard, John Klauk and Beau Hossler. The 76 holes he played in match play tie Leonard (1992) and David Chung (1990) for the most played since the current format began in 1961.

"It's safe to say I played more golf than anybody this week," Hammer said. He played 12 more holes than Riley going into the nal match. Asked if he wanted to play an emergency nine, Hammer quipped, "Oh my gosh, I'm ready to hit the bed."

Hammer needed 20 holes to beat Brandon Wu in the morning semi nal, while Riley was a 4 and 2 winner over Tyler Strafaci in the other semi nal.

Hammer was 2-up after 11 holes, but Wu birdied three straight holes to square the match, then rallied again on the 18th by rolling in an 18-footer for birdie after bogeying the par-3 17th.

Hammer won the match with an approach to about four feet on the par-4 second hole after Wu missed the fairway with his tee shot, missed the green with his approach, and was 40 feet from the pin with his third shot. The par-saving putt missed and it was handshake time.

In the semi nals, Riley advanced with a straightforward 4 and 2 victory over Tyler Strafaci, but Hammer, leading 2-up after 11 holes, suddenly found himself facing someone as hot as

he had been all week.

Wu birdied the 12th through 14th holes, winning two of the three to square the match, then rallied again on the 18th by rolling in an 18-footer for birdie to force extra holes after bogeying and losing the par-3 17th.

Hammer won the match with an approach to about four feet on the par-4 second hole after Wu missed the fairway with his tee shot, missed the

green with his approach, and was 40 feet from the pin with his third shot. The par-saving putt missed and it was handshake time.

Of Friday's quarter nal, Hammer said, "It was a ght." He went 18 holes with Georgia junior Spencer Ralston in the afternoon.

Hammer, down two holes with ve to play, got off the green canvas of Sunset Ridge's expertly manicured fairways for a 1 up victory partly via his own game and partly because of a bad break that befell Ralston when he stood 2-up and had belted a drive within 140 yards of the cup on the par-4 14th hole. Hammer was ve yards ahead.

Hammer's drive was on the carpet. Ralston's sat down in a divot.

"It was an unfortunate break but I still thought I could get a club on it," Ralston said.

He tried to, but Ralston's wedge sailed off to the right near a tree, and left him with a bad angle to the agstick.

"The fairways were getting kinda rm and it came off the hosel a little bit," Ralston said.

Hammer, conversely, dropped his wedge within eight feet and sank the putt for a birdie, his rst of the round, to close within a hole.

"Turning point," Hammer said, who nonetheless felt for Ralston. "He got so unlucky a couple times today. He tried to get on top of it and it came off the heel a little bit."

Hammer told caddie mom Allison, "Might be an opening," when he saw Ralston's ball in the divot. Then he took advantage with the close-in wedge and birdie putt.

"It gave me some momentum," Hammer said. He would follow up by winning the par-3 15th hole with a par to square the match, take the par-5 16th to go 1-up via a brilliant second shot to about



18 feet for a two-putt birdie, and match Ralston with a bogey on the treacherous par-3 17th and a par 4 on the 18th, the latter with a baby-soft chip from the rough to within three inches of the cup. Ralston's bid to square and extend the match, a 12-foot putt, edged the lip on the left side and stayed out.

"I thought it was in," Ralston said.

Hammer's 1-up victory advanced him to the semi nal against Brandon Wu, who outlasted John Augenstein in 19 holes. On the other half of the bracket, Tyler Strafaci, the grandson of 1953 Western Amateur medalist Frank Strafaci, beat Kaiwen Lio, 2 up, while Riley knocked off Hayden Springer, 5 and 3.

"We didn't play great golf for a while, and then, middle of the back nine, we started to play like ourselves," Hammer said. "The course was rmer and it was windier this afternoon, and the greens were faster, but I think we were a little bit tired after 36 holes yesterday, nishing late, having the dinner that lasted until 9:30 and then getting up this morning. I think that was a little bit of a factor."

Hammer had gone 2-up with a long two-putt birdie on the par-5 13th, leaving a 60-foot putt 10 feet short but sinking that putt to win the hole after Hammer had driven his tee shot next to the lip of a fairway bunker and had to wedge out.

"I felt didn't have a whole lot of energy out there on 13," Hammer said. "Him making birdie sucked some more out of me and I told myself, 'Man, you cannot do this. You're still in this. Fight!"

Hammer may be 18, but with a U.S. Open appearance in 2015 and a U.S. Amateur Four-Ball title in his pocket from earlier this year, he has

plenty of experience to draw on. And he has the spunky attitude of the former shortstop that he is.

At that point, however, Ralston, a 20-year-old Gainesville, Ga., native, looked and felt in control.

"I was pretty positive there, like, 'Get on a roll.' Then I drove it in a divot," Ralston said. "I think him kind of seeing that before I even hit kinda changed his mindset a little bit.

"It's a funny game we play."

It is, but Ralston, whose next stop is the U.S. Amateur at Pebble Beach, enhanced his reputa-

tion with excellent play all week.

"It's one of the best elds in the world in amateur tournaments," Ralston said. "It kind of proves to yourself you belong. There's a lot of positives. You can't hang your head."

In the morning, Hammer needed 20 holes and scored only even par but by beating six-for-one stroke-play playoff survivor Davis Shore.

Hammer saw Shore square the match parring the par-3 17th, but birdied the second extra hole – only his third birdie of the round after 24 in the 72-hole stroke play competition – to advance.

**LIVE AND IN COLOR** First-time national (and worldwide) television coverage was provided by streaming close to 12 hours of action on the Western Amateur and Golf Channel websites. It was the first live TV of a Western Am since 1961, and that was confined to viewers of WDSU-TV in New Orleans.

Ralston knocked off local favorite Patrick Flavin of Highwood 3 and 2 after trailing 2 up at the turn. Ralston strung together four straight birdies beginning at the 10th to take a 1-up lead, then watched Flavin bogey the 14th to take a 2-up edge. Flavin's three bogeys on the back nine helped seal his fate in his nal amateur start. He'll turn pro for the Illinois Open.

Sam Stevens, whose 51-foot birdie putt tied him with Hammer for the stroke-play medal, was run over by 15th-seeded Liu in his match. Liu was 5-under, including the usual concessions, over 14

holes.

Riley was gunning for his second straight victory in Illinois. He'd captured the Illini Invitational at Olympia Fields Country Club last year.

Riley couldn't feel too bad considering how well he played all week. He perked up even more when it was noted that last year's runner-up, Doc Redman, won the U.S. Amateur a fortnight later.

"That's a good statistic there," Riley said.

His next stop? The U.S. Amateur at Pebble Beach.

Hammer will be there as well.

he numbers are staggering. Four trips around TPC Deere Run in 257 strokes. Thirty birdies. Over 400 feet of putts holed. A finish at 27-under-par. An

eight-stroke victory.

Consider each a record for the 48 playings of the John Deere Classic, and consider this: Michael Kim, author of all of the above, is only now finding his game after five years as a professional.

No wonder he couldn't get back to sleep after waking up at 4:30 a.m. Sunday, July 15, finding it

difficult to sleep on a five-stroke lead.

"I went on the Internet to see how to slow my heartbeat down, and everything said, 'Take deep breaths,' and I'm like, 'I've been taking deep breaths for 30 minutes!' "Kim said.

That didn't work, and watching the Wimbledon men's final and part of the World Cup final



proved only minor distractions. Instead, Kim's mind worked overtime.

"I probably went through a million different scenarios," Kim said. "Making birdies out of the gate, losing the lead after a few holes. It wasn't all confidence with the season I've had. It would have been weird if I was 100 percent confident."

Kim, who turned 25 on the Saturday of the third round, had made the cut in only eight of 22 previous starts this season. Now, by virtue of steamrolling the field, he flew off to Carnoustie for the British Open, will get an invitation to next year's Masters, has an exemption through the 2019-20 season on the PGA Tour, and is a lock for at least the first tournament in this year's playoffs.

Not bad for a South Korean-born American who grew up in San Diego watching Tiger Woods win week after week on television.

"As a kid you don't really know how hard that is, how much work that takes," Kim said. "To be sitting here with the trophy, I'm at a loss for words.

"I think I made the right career choice."

Bronson Burgoon (closing 69), Joel Dahmen (65), Francesco Molinari (64) and Sam Ryder (66) deadlocked for second at 19-under 265. That would have won 10 of the previous 18 tournaments at Deere Run. Instead, Kim's nine-stroke victory matched the total margin of victory for the previous 10 John Deere Classics.

Molinari, who had won the Quicken Loans tourney prior to the Deere, rebounded nicely after the charter flight to the British Open, which ferried 16 players across the pond. He won at Carnoustie, and was last seen hugging the Claret Jug.

Said Burgoon, who played with Kim, "He

just was rolling them in from everywhere and hit a couple of really good iron shots. He did what he had to do. Going into the back nine, unless he had a torrential meltdown, we were all playing for second."

A recent coaching change has Kim hitting more fairways than before – 46 of 56 this week – and his new mental trigger for putting is worth a about million bucks: the \$1,044,000 he earned for winning.

The most settling factor for Kim on Sunday

was one of the first he considered: making birdies out of the gate. He birdied the first three holes – a run of seven straight adding him his final four holes on Saturday – and stretched his lead to an eventual nine strokes at mid-round.

"I expected a lot of the guys like Harold and Francesco and Matt and Bronson – they weren't going to just let me ease my way into the trophy," Kim said. "I felt I needed to make birdies on the front nine just to show I'm still playing well. Seeing that ball drop on No. 1 for birdie was great.



To see it drop (on No. 2) really, really calmed me down. On 3, I don't know. As soon as I lined it up it felt like it was going to go in."

The putts went in from 12, 15 and 24 feet, and like that, he was 25-under and threatening Steve Stricker's record of 26-under 258, set in 2010. He matched it with a 7-foot birdie putt on No. 8 and surpassed it with a 20-foot putt for a deuce on the par-3 16th.

After that one, he cupped his left hand to his ear to better enjoy the cheers of the crowd, one which usually enjoys a battle down the stretch but this time roared for a rout.

"Did Patrick Reed do something like that at the Ryder Cup? I felt I got it from him," Kim said. "Once I got past 15, I felt I could do whatever the last three holes and still get away with the trophy. I think I got a little excited."

He was even more excited when, upon reaching the 18th green, he spied his family on the big video screen. Then he saw them standing on the hillside. After his final putt dropped, there was a hugfest.

Kim had been average on the PGA Tour before this week, playing 254 rounds before Thursday's career low 63. To follow that with a pair of 64s, as he did Friday and Saturday, is difficult for a veteran pro, much less someone seeking his first victory on the big circuit. The 3.1 inches of rain that soaked Deere Run during the tournament, thunderstorms stopping the action for a total of 4 hours 44 minutes, twice on Friday and again on Saturday when the delayed second round was completed, didn't have as much to do with his low scores as what was in his mind.

"I'm just feeling more confident over my tee shots, which have been a problem for me the last

couple of years," Kim said. "Any time I feel comfortable over my tee shots I'm pretty stress-free and can have a good time out there."

Then there was the putting. He took only 106 putts in the course of the week.

"I think it's more of a mental thing for me," Kim said. "Thursday morning just warming up I kind of found a little mental note with me, and it's been working for me so far. Just ignore the leader board as much as you can, ignore the scores. Just me and the golf course."

It's hardly a surprise that Kim was a first-time PGA Tour winner. That, aside from the phenomenal charity contributions local groups use the tournament for through the Birdies for Charity initiative, is the Deere's specialty of the house.





## The caddie from Twitter (and Park Ridge)

lias Francque, who turned 17 on Friday of tournament week, received an early birthday present when Steven Bowditch picked him from a large number of Twitter hopefuls to caddie for him. Francque, from Park Ridge, started caddieing at Park Ridge Country Club. About 30 loops into his caddie career, he was on the PGA Tour, and getting as much attention as his player.

"I was nervous on the rst tee, but it got better after that," Francque said. Bowditch scored 2-over 73 on Thursday and would miss the cut by six strokes after a second-round 72.

Still, there was one big thrill when he holed out for eagle from 172 yards on the par-4 fth, the only eagle of the day on a par 4 hole.

"Only club the kid pulled all day," Bowditch kidded.

Francque, who has a pair of uncles who work for John Deere, stayed with his grandparents in nearby Geneseo this week.

He gained an instant doctorate in the ne art of caddie work when he scored the job thanks to a Twitter answer that concluded, "I love Australia."

That didn't hurt in Bowditch's mind. His usual caddie was working elsewhere because Bowditch didn't think he was in the eld, but late withdrawals by others on the Sunday be-

fore opened the spot, so he decided to do for someone what John Senden had done for him years earlier: give a kid a shot.

This was Bowditch's Twitter help wanted ad: "The best response/reason gets the job. 2pm Tues start, nish Friday. 1% chance Sunday. Payment: all leftover gloves and balls are yours." An emoji of a winking face followed.

From the moment Bowditch picked him up

across the street in caddie parking – Francque naturally didn't have a PGA Tour caddie ID – Francque was all ears. And smiles.

"On the Tour, they have the changing of the ag (from caddie to caddie) on the green, and how to rake a bunker a certain way," Francque said. "I learned that; it's different from my normal caddying stuff.

"It's been a great experience."



Kim is the 22nd rst-time Tour winner since Sam Adams was the rst in 1973, the second straight following Bryson DeChambeau, and the fourth in six years, including Jordan Spieth and Brian Harman.

Kim lit his birthday cake with a Saturday 64, his second straight to go with an opening 63, and birdied ve of his last six holes, including the last four, played after the day's second thunderstorm delay, to stand at 22-under 191 and open a ve-stroke lead on Burgoon, whose 5-under 66 brought him to 17-under 196, entering the nal 18 holes. Close behind, but in the nal analysis not close enough, were Matt Jones (66 for 16-under 200), Harold Varner III (66 for 15-under 201) and Andres Romero and Ryder (14-under 202).

Such an advantage might make some players nervous, but Kim was cool about it all.

"Try and stay aggressive, stick to the game plan," Kim said. "It's been working so far. I've got a decent-sized lead but a lot can happen in 18 holes."

Most of what happened, Kim created.

#### Hardy finishes with a run

Northbrook's Nick Hardy came into the nal round stuck in 55th place, having played the rst 54 holes in 5-under-par 208. That's good but not great.

He red a nal 5-under-par 66, including seven birdies in the last 10 holes, which jumped him to 43rd on 10-under 274, a spot he shared with, among others, former Illinois teammate Dylan Meyer and fellow alum Steve Stricker. It also earned him \$18,096.

It could have been better. He missed a 23-inch par putt on the second hole and later bladed a wedge. Fix those two shots and the payday is

around \$36,000.

"Obviously I had stuff out there that doesn't happen too much," Hardy said. "I tried to keep a good attitude and nish as well as I could. I put together a really good nal 10 holes, which feels good."

Hardy is six weeks into a pro career that started at the Rust-Oleum Championship. So far, he's made the cut in all four tournaments – two on the web. com Tour – and earned \$36,951. That's promising, but guarantees nothing. After Monday's Rockford Pro-Am, that's what his schedule has on it. Nothing.

"I've played well the past four tournaments but I haven't played as well as I could," Hardy said. "This last 10 holes, moving on to the rest of the summer, is going to give me some con dence for sure."

Burgoon had a great plan for the trip to Carnoustie: "I'm going to have a glass of red wine and I'm going to pass out." ... Kim ran his career earnings to \$3,008,729 on the PGA Tour, plus \$318,637 on his web. com Tour play.

lmost everyone in the eld was smiling before the start of the Inaugural U.S. Senior Women's Open. The United States Golf Association, which added the tournament to its annual dance card. was treating the eld of 120 players royally, and

they in turn were doing nothing but whispering sweet nothings back to the boys and girls in the navy blue jackets.

It was a love affair at Chicago Golf Club.

For a few minutes on Thursday, July 12, even after "The Star-Spangled Banner" was sung and the USGA ag raised to top off the opening ceremony at Wheaton woke up for the day, after JoAnne Carner had belted the rst tee shot in

tournament history down the middle of the rst fairway at precisely 7 a.m., all was copacetic. It was Woodstock on the prairie.

Then the rst of several players who plunked their tee shot on the par-3 10th on the back of the green, with the cup smack in the middle of said green, proceeded to putt off the green and into the bunker fronting the putting surface.

Only then was the rst smoke detected com-



ing out of players' ears. It would not be the last.

It was a USGA championship, after all, and those are among the few competitions in golf each year designed to separate the best from the rest.

By the end of the week, that task had been accomplished. England's Laura Davies, better known as Dame Laura on the other side of the pond, had separated herself from the eld by 10 strokes over Juli Inkster, one of the others tabbed as a likely suspect to emerge victorious.

Davies plundered the Charles Blair MacDonald-Seth Raynor course heartily, scoring 16-under-par 276 – par was set at 73 thanks to the inability to shorten a par 4 to a proper length for the 50-plus set – to Inkster's 286 and third-place Trish Johnson's 4-under 288. (Johnson, who won the Inaugural LPGA Senior, the rst distaff senior major, last year at French Lick, was another of the favorites, and bidding to go two-for-two.)

Davies' route to the title was simple. She shared second with Johnson and Liselotte Neumann with an opening 2-under 71 (Elaine Crosby, 60, one of the quali ers at Conway Farms Golf Club, opened with a 70 to lead), added another 71 to keep pace with Johnson on top on Friday, poured in a 75-foot eagle putt Saturday on the 12th green en route to a 7-under 66 to open a vestroke lead, and ran away from Inkster and Co. with a closing 68.

At the end, there was less tension than at a supermarket opening, so thoroughly had Davies dissected the layout. It was a coronation, tting for someone who had already been honored by Queen Elizabeth II. At 54, Davies may not feel ancient, but she is royal, and managed to add the newest championship in golf to an already-over-stuffed resume.

"I think 10 was the turning point," said Da-

vies of the nal round. "I hit my rst really rank shot of the week, a horrible block-out to the right, and left a ridiculous putt, and somehow managed to two-putt it. I'll be honest; it wasn't the greatest hole I've ever played, but I think that was when I really started to think I might have one hand on the trophy and just had to get the other one in there."

No worries. When Davies parred the 13th and Inkster double-bogeyed, the lead was eight strokes. It was a parade from there, Davies lead-

ing the way.

Amazingly, Davies hadn't won in eight years.

"My last win was in India in 2010, so there's the pressure you're playing under when you're trying to prove to yourself you can still win," Davies said. "So this ranks highly up there. And obviously because it's a USGA event, it's hard to compare tournaments, but this is very high on my list of achievements, I can assure you."

Davies, Inkster and Johnson played together

in the nal round, and to Johnson, the competition was over just after the turn.

"As she said earlier, she hadn't won for eight years," said fellow Englishwoman Johnson of Davies. "That's a long time, even for someone as good as she is. But when she made that putt on 10, you see she had a little pump of the st, which Laura doesn't do a lot, and yeah, it was pretty much in the bag then."

Davies earned \$180,000 from the \$1 million purse the USGA posted, with Inkster collecting \$108,000, but this really was a case for the honor and glory being more important than the cash. For one thing, Davies understood not only the significance of being the rst champion, but that the Senior Women's Open will endure through the

years, becoming a goal for all of today's LPGA regulars. That's something Davies and her peers didn't have.

"The girls who are playing the regular Tour now, they might be in their 30s or 40s, but I know it's on Karrie Webb's radar, and everyone is interested in a U.S. Open championship," Davies said. "It's great for the girls on the Tour and all the amateurs around the world. We've had a few come from overseas qualifying, so people are really interested, and it's a great chance to play championship golf again for the over-50s."

Crosby slid back into the pack with a second-round 78 and nished tied for 23rd at 13-over 305.

The leading nisher from the Conway Farms

quali er was Jamie Fischer, the teaching professional at Conway. Fischer, who turned 50 just in time to qualify, closed with a 2-under 71 for 7-over 299 and tied for 12th, earning \$18,174.

Fischer nished ahead of such LPGA legends as Hollis Stacy, Amy Alcott, Betsy King and Pat Bradley.

That quartet made the cut, and made some wonder how they would have fared had the USGA started the Senior Women's Open 15 years earlier.

Then again, there was no groundswell for such a tournament – aside from the hopes of the players – until recently. The presence of the Legends Tour, headed by Jane Blalock – who missed the cut, which fell at 12-over 158 and kept 55



players for the weekend – prompted the USGA to announce the creation, and Chicago Golf as the site, at the USGA's annual meeting in 2015.

After a successful inaugural featuring Davies' spectacularly good play, and more interest than anticipated – the USGA ran through its original 5,000 tickets and had to print 5,000 more – the future seems assured. Next year's edition will be played May 16-19 at the late Peggy Kirk Bell's Pine Needles Resort and Lodge in Southern Pines, N.C., around the corner from Pinehurst. Unfortunately from a golf spotlight standpoint, that's the same weekend as the spring-bound PGA Championship. And for gambler and horse-owner Davies, that's also the same weekend as the Preakness Stakes.

Johnson is counting the days, she so enjoyed the inaugural despite the tire tracks from Davies on her back.

"Honestly, it's one of the best, most enjoyable weeks I've ever played in any tournament anywhere," Johnson said on Sunday night. "This morning, as I was waiting to come out here, I thought, God, not often do I actually think how lucky I am to do what I do because it can be really hard work – it can be very rewarding, but it can be really hard work as well. I thought, my God, I'm actually playing in the last round of the U.S. Open with Juli Inkster and Laura Davies. It doesn't get a lot better than that. I thought, just go and enjoy myself because everybody would kill to be in my position."

Crosby's opening 70 came in the afternoon, after Davies and Johnson had posted their 71s, and long after Carner, the eight-time USGA champion, had opened with the big tee shot that helped her shoot her age - a 79.

""I saw the scores were pretty high this morn-

ing, and I thought, uh-oh," Crosby said. "I just managed it well. My caddie and I were very careful on the yardages and where we put the ball on the green, and I rolled it really well today."

Crosby was a two-time LPGA Tour winner, but long ago gave up the travel grind and regular golf for something more important: she's president of Lumen Christi Catholic High in Jackson, Mich.

"I was kind of disappointed that I wasn't exempt, but I think that made me work even harder to get here, because this is history for women's golf," said Crosby, whose 72 at Conway Farms easily earned her a spot at Chicago Golf.

Her opening round of textbook golf. Birdies on the 12th, 13th and 18th holes to go out 3-under. An even-par 36 inward nine on the front side. A spiffy 70 to take the lead.

The bigger names came to the fore on Friday, which was not unexpected.

Carner played three full practice rounds at Chicago Golf, walking each day, to get ready for the no-cart grind. Alas, she missed the cut.

It's not likely that the second playing will see

quite the turnout from the 60-plus set, but some who missed this year, including Beth Daniel (who will be 62) and Nancy Lopez, who couldn't play this year because of injury but was drafted to run the rst tee, might play next year.

But it will be Dame Laura Jane Davies whose name will forever be rst on the trophy.

#### **Around Chicago Golf**

Patricia Ehrhart nished tied for 23rd, but the 2017 U.S. Senior Women's Amateur semi nalist was noticed more for the presence of pal Jimmy Buffett, who joined her earlier in the week. "He's credentialed as my player instructor, so that's pretty funny," Ehrhart said. "But he turned into the caddie on Monday (Buffett wore a caddie bib). Then somebody turned him into my uncle, so God knows what he's going to be by tomorrow." ... Buffett's presence was typical of the unique atmosphere around the week. Whereas USGA competitions are usually populated by uptight competitors and of cials, the buzz was low-key outside the romps and not quite high-pressure inside them, with the exception of the usual grousing over pin placements – as exempli ed by Thursday's apparently benign placing on No. 10. ... # Singh signs in

Fijian beats Maggert for first senior major

ijay Singh has always been an enigma.

A superior striker of the ball, a good short-game player, and a fine putter, he's been a part of the pro game for decades, but he's also been apart from it.

The scorecard-altering scandal on the Asian Tour in the 1980s has always dogged him, largely because he's never talked about it, is the first item that has distanced him. The curious case of the deer antler spray – the what?, almost everyone said when the PGA Tour said it was verboten – and the ongoing legal case between Singh and the Tour, is the second.

Singh comes to the course, works at the end of the range where he can't see anyone, plays his round, shakes the hands of his fellow competitors, likely goes back to the range, and thence to his hotel.

Rinse and repeat for four days.

The three-time major championship winner is respected by spectators, but good luck finding a Vijay Singh fan club this side of Fiji. Thus, when he captured the 36th Senior Players Championship at Exmoor Country Club, beating Jeff Maggert on the second hole of sudden death on July 15, he was lauded and applauded, but nobody thought of holding a parade into downtown Highland Park.

Which, for Singh, who turned 50 this year, is too bad. That he'll never get the accolades he

would otherwise be due is entirely on him. For those who watch him, there are always the whispers.

In this case, his touring Exmoor in rounds of 68, 67, 66 and 67 strokes spoke volumes. He and Maggert, whose road to a matching 20-under-par 68 came about in rounds of 66, 68, 66 and 68 strokes, played the old layout, remodeled by Donald Ross over a century ago and updated since while retaining all its character, about as well as it could be played across 72 holes. Then they went out and played some more, and Singh birdied the



18th hole the second time they played it in overtime while Maggert, who nearly birdied it on the rst playoff go-round, was making par.

"I had the same yardage the rst time around, and I just yanked the shot way left, and I was fortunate that Jeff didn't make his putt," Singh said. "The second time around, my caddie said, hey, you know, you're the best second-shot player I've ever known because every time you mis-hit a shot, you drop a ball, you hit it really good, and I just took that into account and I just aimed it right at it and hit it, and it just came out perfect."

It was Singh's rst senior major, and second title on the 50-plus circuit. Singh has a Masters and two PGA Championships in his majors trophy case, and now a lovely piece of crystal to go with those.

"It's a little different," Singh said. "You know, it's a senior major, you know, so it's – any time you win a tournament no matter what it is, you feel accomplishment, and that's what I feel. I feel like I played well, and it's a win. A win is a win."

Singh and Maggert pulled away from a crowded leader board with their nishing rounds, ending up two strokes ahead of Brandt Jobe (closing 66 for 270), three ahead of Jerry Kelly and Scott McCarron (271) and four up on the quartet of Duffy Waldorf, Kenny Perry, Scott Parel and Bart Bryant (272).

"I had an opportunity on 18 there," Maggert said of the regulation nish. "I hit it in there pretty close and just hit kind of a – just pulled the putt a little bit. I felt like 21-, 22-under was kind of a good target score today. I didn't think 20 would be enough. I was fortunate enough to get in the playoff."

Said Singh, "The leader board was so crowd-

ed when we started off. Jeff took the lead, I think. He birdied the rst hole, and then McCarron was up there, too. But then after seven, eight holes, I think Jeff was in the lead and I was just one back, and we literally made birdies on the same holes. And then he made that bogey on 16. He played really well. He did not miss a shot except that shot on 16.

"So it kind of gave me a little breathing space, and I got a great up-and-down on 17. But any time you play with somebody that – if you're chasing or tied with, in the same group, obviously it's like a match play, you know. So you kind of know what you have to do. The last shot, I thought I stiffed it but came up short and almost made it. It was right in front of me. I knew if I could win or lose, it was right there. Fortunately for me, Jeff missed a couple of makable putts on the last hole, so it gave me a chance to win."

Before Singh and Maggert pulled away, the most curious story of the week was Mike Small's barging into contention and staying there.

Coming off solid showings in the senior tournaments in Des Moines and Madison, which quali ed the Illinois men's coach for the Senior Players, Small opened with a 7-under 65 and shared the rst-round lead with Perry.

Small punched out a 6-under 66 in the third round and was at 14-under 202 entering the nal round, two strokes behind Maggert, Bryant and McCarron and playing in the third-from-last pairing with Bernhard Langer, Mr. Senior himself, with only Singh, at 201, between him and the leaders.

Small's closing 71 was decent, but not what he needed, and he landed in a three-way tie for 10th with Glen Day and Miguel Angel Jimenez, earning \$67,200.

Kim rolls over field for first pro victory, Nowlin second

ere's how Hannah Kim goes about her business: Head down. Ignorant of scoreboards. Talking about everything but golf with her caddie.

Oh, and making a crazy amount of birdies when her game is on, as it was for a magical week at Mistwood Golf Club.

Kim's 5-under-par 67 in the final round, following rounds of 68 and 65, brought her a sixstroke victory and a scoring record in the 24th Phil Kosin Illinois Women's Open. The Santa Ana, Calif., total of 16-under-par 200 obliterated the previous record by seven strokes and allowed her to coast to a six-stroke victory over amateur Tristyn Nowlin – who actually surpassed the old mark of 207, held jointly by Annika Welander and Stephanie Miller, about 30 seconds before Kim sank her winning putt.

For Kim, the outcome was not too shabby for someone in her third start as a professional, following the Ohio Open and California Open. Not that Kim had any idea records were falling like autumn leaves, either.

"I was really trying not to look (at the scoreboards)," Kim said. "I was glad my friend Kylie

was along. We talked about random stuff, like what's my favorite food."

Over the ball, Kim was all business. She plundered Mistwood for 17 birdies in 54 holes, had only one bogey – on the seventh hole in the first round, making her last 47 holes bogey-free – and nearly aced the par-3 17th in the final round, dropping a 7-iron two feet behind the cup from 133 yards. That set up birdie No. 17.

Kim tied for third two years ago and was second last year. Now she's won, and collected \$5,000 from the \$25,000 purse for doing so. She's 26-under-par in nine rounds on a golf course that isn't easy, unless you play like she did.

Kim's musical tastes run to Christian music, so she had Tauren Wells in her ears while warming up for Tuesday's second round. That inspired her to birdie the first two holes by rolling in 30-foot-plus putts from the fringe.

"Unexpected," Kim said of those. "I was really surprised with that. It was a weird start."

Kim birdied 11 of her 27 holes from the back nine of the first round through the end of the second, including a converting a 7-iron to five feet on the par-3 17th, and had only one bogey in the first 36.

Her fine play wasn't confined to Mistwood. The following week, Kim won the Tennessee

Women's Open, scoring 4-under 212 to beat Ashli Bunch of Morristown, Tenn., and Maria Fernanda Lira Solis of Mexico City, by a stroke at Stonehenge Golf Club in Fair eld Glade, Tenn.

"One of the things I was actually thinking about coming up 18 was no state event is the same," Kim told Tennesseegolf.com. "The Illinois Open was not like this one. I was in the lead at the Illinois Open and I didn't feel the nerves that I felt here."

"I think it was just knowing that I needed to beat Fernanda. Having her three-putt on 17, it was not something I was expecting, so that got my heart racing. And the Illinois Open, I had a bigger gap between second place so I could golf a little more comfortably."

Kim romped at Mistwood, yet Nowlin's aggregate of 206 would have won every other Illinois Women's Open. However, the Richmond, Ky., resident – entering her senior year on Illinois' golf team – could only match Kim's 67 in the nal round and thus settled for low amateur honors. She needed a 60 thanks to Kim, who never wandered into Mistwood's ever-present fescue. Considering everything, Nowlin was cool with her second runner-up playing of the summer at Mistwood. She was also second in the Women's Western Amateur.

"This was my last tournament of the summer, so it feels good to end it like this," Nowlin said.

"We were just out there having fun. If somebody's making putts, I'm not going to affect them or left them affect me."

Sarah Burnham of Maple Grove, Minn., took third, with a 4-under 68 for 6-under 210. Like Kim, Burnham recently turned pro after earning Big Ten player of the year honors at Michigan State.

LPGA veteran Nicole Jeray of Berwyn was fourth following a 1-under 71 for 4-under 212. She made two early birdies, bogeyed the par-3 seventh, and parred in.

Defending champion Alexandra Farnsworth of Nashville, and Vanderbilt University, tied for sixth, scoring 3-over 75 for 1-under 215 despite tendinitis in her right wrist.

#### **Around Mistwood**

Bobbi Stricker was a surprise late withdrawal in the morning. That dropped the final field to 29 players. Had she withdrawn on Tuesday, before the final pairings were made, the four players who tied at 8-over 152 would have been tied for 30th, rather then 31st, and made the final round. Instead, pros Allison Finney and Stacey Miller and amateurs Nikki Marquardt and Reena Sulkar were on the outside looking in. Stricker had scored 3-over 75 with a birdie at the last to play the first 36 holes in 7-over 151 to make the cut on the number. Daddy caddie Steve Stricker, taking a week off from his playing career in the week after the John Deere Classic, gave her a solid read on the 8-footer she sank on the 18th. "I'm doing all right," Steve said of his push-the-cart caddie duties. ... The final round scoring average was 74.966. ... Amateur Brianne Bolden of Mokena opened with a 1-over 73 which included a 9 on the par-5 15th thanks to a pair of tee balls in the water. She finished tied for 11th.

## Hahn it to him

Spring Grove's Badgers star scores coveted title

ordan Hahn had a lot in his favor heading into the final 36 holes of the 88th Illinois Amateur, but not everything.

On his side: A great swing that sends the ball a long way - usually where he wants it to go, the positive outlook that accompanies such talent, and a three-stroke lead at 5-under 135 at Bloomington Country Club at the halfway point.

Against him: A cadre of players from the area who were lurking on the leader board, including Bloomington residents 50-year-old Mike Henry and Rob Wuethrich, the latter like Hahn a collegian, only at nearby Illinois Wesleyan. Oh, and the memory of losing last year's Illinois Am to Patrick Flavin after holding a four-stroke lead.

Hahn said later the latter never crept into his mind. That's just as well, for he had plenty of trouble fending off the former before capturing the title by a stroke, finishing in the rain with 3under-par 277.

Hahn, a 6-foot-8 stick of bamboo - strong

but exible – from Spring Grove, which hugs the Wisconsin border, played the 6,624-yard Bloomington layout, a mix of William Langford and C.D. Wagstaff holes, like a virtuoso for the most part. He led by ve strokes with nine holes to play. He led by three on the 16th tee.

Unlike last year, he hung on.

"Obviously, I made it a little more interesting than need me," Hahn said with a grin after the issue was settled. "It was going to be hard to give that (three-stroke lead) away, and somehow I almost did."

Almost is the key word there. Part of the closeness was thanks to Wuethrich, who birdied two of his last ve holes, including a dif cult 10-foot falling-away putt in the rain on the par-4 17th, to put the pressure on Hahn, who was immediately behind.

Wuethrich managed a par at the last while Hahn was navigating the 17th to the tune of a bogey 5, Hahn having scorched his tee shot well right, forcing a punch out and a third to the uphill green. His par putt missed the hole, as one had on the 15th.

Left-handed Charlie Nikitas, he of the long swing and longer locks, was alreay in at 1-under 279, and Wuethrich was signing for his par-70 for 2-under 278 when Hahn was on the 18th tee. Hahn, likely the longest hitter in the eld – he'd driven next to the green on the par-4, 435-yard seventh hole in the nal round, setting up a kickin birdie – decided to leave the big stick in the bag. He pulled a 4-iron, but still hit his tee shot to the right, this time near a copse of trees. Fortunately for him, there was an opening to the green on the 346-yard home hole. A knockdown punch left him a few feet from the green. Two putts, the nal one from six feet, gave him the trophy, and

"Downhill left-to-right is not the ideal putt, but I poured it in," Hahn said.

He did. Finally and forever, his name will be on the Louis Emmerson Trophy, and in time, in golf, he may become more famous than Louis Emmerson, the governor of Illinois, and apparently a golf fan, when the CDGA started the Illinois Amateur at Quincy Country Club in 1931.

Hahn is entering his senior year at Wisconsin. Ideally, he returns for next year's Illinois Am. But if he turns pro, at least he's on the trophy once.

## The Audubon Trail offers many delights

ots of states have golf trails, and some have received more recognition than Louisiana's Audubon Trail. That's unfortunate, as the Audubon offers much more than golf.

Make no mistake, the Audubon Trail's 15 courses are good. It was named for naturalist/artist John James Audubon, who painted many of his bird studies in Louisiana. Many of the courses are members of the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary, and undergo rigorous screening for membership.

We covered six courses in as many days in 90-degree early-summer heat. All kept our attention throughout, and each had unique features.

Best of the lot, but not by much, was Gray Plantation in Lake Charles, the state's golf hotbed.

Rocky Roquemore, a Georgia-based architect, became prominent in the Chicago area in 1986 when hls Pine Meadow design in Mundelein was named America's Best New Course by Golf Digest. He also did some work on Cog Hill's famed Dubsdread course in Lemont, so I had some familiarity with his architectural style.

I got another taste of just how good an architect Roquemore was while playing Gray Plantation. It's a player-friendly layout with its wide fairways, but it has a great mix of holes. Most notable are a double dogleg par-5 at No. 7 and the par-3 at No. 8 with its stunning bunker complex.

Gray Plantation is one of those semi-private facilities with memberships but accepting public

play. Though there was some debate among my most knowledgeable traveling companions, from my perspective it was the most enjoyable of the Audubon Trail courses.

Understandably, low handicappers might prefer TPC Louisiana, site of the PGA Tour's Zurich Classic of New Orleans. It's a Pete Dye design, and you can never go wrong choosing a Pete Dye course. On our visit the tournament scaffolding was still up, though any comparison between our play and that of the PGA Tour guys was purely coincidental.

The Atchafalaya at Idlewild, in Patterson, is a fun track designed by Robert von Hagge. It has five lakes and some dramatic elevation changes but its most unique touches are the tee markers - they're not color-coded, but rather are named after the habitat in the area. The tees, from front to back, are Otter, Owl, Eagle, Bear and Alligator. I hit from the Owls, a wise move on my part.

The 150-yard markers were also unusual. Rather than using the standard stakes, these were marked by Cypress knees. The camouflage-painted golf carts were a refreshing look.

The Wetlands, in Lafayette, is a tricky layout devised by Frank Burandt, who had formerly been with Nicklaus Design. He made use of the many lakes and – obviously as per the name – wetlands areas. Water comes into play on 11 holes and the greens are well-bunkered.

First course on our agenda, The Golf Course at Audubon Park in New Orleans, was planned

as a warmup round. It's the oldest golf course in Louisiana, dating back to 1898 when it had only six holes. Audubon Park underwent a major transformation when Georgia-based architect Dennis Griffiths created the present layout in 2001.

The length – only 4,220 yards from the tips – may give the impression that Audubon Park is not "real" golf. Each nine has one par-5, two par-4s and six par-3s, all situated in a park that includes a zoo and has a walking/biking trail within the borders of the course. You also get a nice view of the Loyola University chapel. Personnel from that school as well as those from nearby Tulane utilize the facilities, which include a plantation-style clubhouse with good dining options and an outdoor venue for social events like weddings and birthday parties. In short, Audubon Park is a most fun place for more than just golfers.

While The Bluffs on Thompson Creek, in St. Francisville, was shaking off some issues related to flooding, the Arnold Palmer designed course had some excellent holes – especially the 17th, a downhill par-3, and the uphill 18th. James Audubon once studied and illustrated the bird life on what is now holes 11 through 13, and 32 of his paintings were made when he resided in the area.

Other courses on the Trail are Black Bear, the Louisiana State Park's only course in Delhi; the 27-hole Olde Oaks near Shreveport; Cypress Bend Resort in Many; Tamahka Trails at Paragon Casino Resort in Marksville; OakWing, in Alexandria; Carter Plantation, designed by Louisiana native and PGA Championship winner David Toms, in Springfield; and three Baton Rouge area courses — the Robert Trent Jones-designed Santa Maria, links-style Copper Miller and The Island, carved out of a sugar plantation in Plaquemine.

Unlike most of the other golf trails we've vis-

There are other quality layouts off the trail, most notably Contraband Bayou and neighboring Golden Nugget, both by the L'Auberge Casino Resort, and The National Golf Club of Louisiana, all in the Lake Charles area.

Just as New Orleans is more than just Mardi Gras, Louisiana is more than just golf. But, the golf is good, affordable and – perhaps best of all – accessible to far more attractions than most of the nation's other golf trails.

While in New Orleans we hung out for a while at the French Quarter, dining at Dickie Brennan's Tableau and enjoying the night life of the Bourbon O Bar at the Bourbon Orleans Hotel.

The historical offerings were outstanding in upscale St. Francisville, particularly a church cemetery that had gravesites dating back to the mid-1800s. We also were told of the once brutal but now reincarnated Angola Prison.

We petted baby alligators while getting a tour of the Bayou Rum distillery in Lacassine. We enjoyed a terrific Cajun style dinner at L'Auberge Casino's Jack Daniels Bar & Grill, where super chef Lyle Broussard detailed each offering.

We learned how Tabasco has been made on Avery Island for the last 150 years and we had both a French-style breakfast and spirited musical pre-dinner entertainment at Mouton Plantation Bed and Breakfast in Lafayette. We also enjoyed a scenic boat cruise and a great meal on board at Lake End Park in Morgan City. Obviously there's plenty to enjoy in Louisiana besides the golf.

What intrigued us the most was the Blue Dog Café in Lafayette. The food is served amidst a collection of artworks by artist George Rodrigue, who became famous after he started including blue dogs with haunting eyes in his creations. This side trip was made even more memorable when we met Jacques Rodrigue, son of the famed artist who passed away in 2013. Jacques gave us an inside look at the work his father had done.

Lafayette was declared "America's Happiest City" by *The Wall Street Journal* and you get a hint why as soon as you see the city's welcome sign. The "Y" in Lafayette is missing – and for a good reason. The missing letter creates a great photo op. Stand in the spot of the missing letter in the "Welcome to Lafayette" declaration, which is near a fountain in the middle of town, with your arms upraised. That's where you realize that the "Y" stands for "You."

You can't help but smile after learning that tidbit. Indeed, Lafayette might be America's Happiest City, but everyone we encountered in Louisiana seemed happy with their surroundings, too.

# AROUND ILLINOIS India holds off Holtz in Illinois Open

Then flys to San Francisco, places 24th in Web.com tournament

ince India was airborne about two hours after his final putt dropped at The Glen Club to win the 69th Illinois Open.

Yes, he still needed a plane.

India, who calls Deerfield home, added a final-round 6-under-par 66 to rounds of 72 and 64 to finish what became an endurance test at 14-under-par 202 and beat Bloomington football equipment salesman Brendan Holtz by a stroke early Wednesday evening.

"It was a grind," said India, who had to finish the second round in the morning and then regroup for his 2:10 p.m. tee time. "I had to really talk myself out of thinking too far ahead and pull the reins back in. I did a good job for not being in this position for a long time."

India's bogey-free round featured birdies on the first, second, eighth, 10th and 12th holes before he came ever-so-close on Nos. 13, 14 and 15. But a birdie 4 at the last after a cart path-aided drive of almost 400 yards ended up making the difference against Holtz, who was in the final group and also birdied the final hole after an enormous drive.

"I'd be lying if I said I wasn't nervous, but I'm glad I pulled myself together and made some really committed swings down the final three holes," India said. "I didn't really put myself in a lot of trouble out there. My short game bailed me out when it had to."

For India, the victory was not only lucrative – to the tune of \$19,004 – but a mental boost for the Web.com tournament starting Thursday. He caught a late flight to San Francisco, and was on the tee in the Ellie Mae Classic at 9:06 a.m. Pacific Time.

"I'm going to have a lot of drinks on the plane, which is great, probably a couple Bloody Marys, most likely watch a movie and pass out," said India, who, battling a wonky back, has made the cut in two of seven starts on the circuit this season, earning \$2,964. "My health's better and I'm able to swing the club a little bit better too. I think the golf swing's finally coming back."

India fired a 68 in the first round in the Ellie Mae, added a 64 in the second round, and eventually finished tied for 24th thanks to a closing 65, earning \$4,933. In all, it was a \$23,937 week for him.

Holtz, who tied for second to earn \$13,063, and was low pro last year, erred with a bogey on the par-3 17th, hitting his tee shot fat and leaving

himself 12 feet for par after a so-so chip. He hit the 18th green in two and had an 18-foot uphill left-breaking putt that broke a little more than he expected.

"That sucker turned real hard," Holtz said. "I wasn't going to leave it short, though."

It was the 17th hole, a vexing par-3, that bit Holtz for the second year running.

"Bad bogey," Holtz said. "I did the same thing last year, same situation. That hole, I have some redemption coming. I need to get back here and do it again.

"It's a roller-coaster golf game I have. I struck the ball really well, but had a three-putt bogey (on No. 8) and No. 17, it's just kind of kicking my butt."

India's birdie on No. 8 just before Holtz bogeyed earned India a share of the lead with amateur David Perkins of East Moline, a member of the Illinois State golf team who captured the CDGA Amateur earlier this summer, and is in the running for the amateur of the year title. Perkins went out in 3-under 33, added birdies on Nos. 14 and 15 to get to 13-under, parred the 16th and stepped onto the 17th tee. Quickly he was pointing east and shouting "Fore left!"

"I hit a 'you know what,' " Perkins said, avoiding the word shank. "First time in competition."

The ball sailed into the nasty fescue-gorse between the 17th and first greens, and might be found years from now. Perkins had to settle for double-bogey and finished at with 3-under 69 for 11-under 205, tied for third with Brian Bullington of Frankfort, who also scored 69.

"Still a solid week," Perkins said. "I thought early in the day I was in control, in the lead or close to it. Turned out I was in it all day until 17.

The second round ended late on Wednesday morning with David Cooke and Holtz on top at 9-under 135, Cooke finishing with a 6-under 66 and Holtz scoring 67. India's 64 brought him into a into a six-way tie for third at 8-under 136, along with amateurs Brendan O'Reilly and CDGA amateur champion David Perkins and pros Daniel Hudson, Andy Mickelson and Brian Bullington. ... The cut fell at 1-over 145, with 57 players advancing. ... Defending champion Patrick Flavin finished tied for 30th at 2-under 214 to cash his first check as a pro. ... The tournament's second ace was registered by Jeff Kellen of Machesney Park with his first swing of the day. He drilled a 176-yard 7-iron into the cup on the 17th hole, a stroke that helped him to solo fifth at 10-under 206. Garrett Chaussard aced the ninth hole on Tuesday with a 226-yard 3-wood, but missed the cut. Scoring on Page 34.

Steve Sawtell and Michael Natale captured their second CDGA Amateur Four-Ball title on Wednesday, Aug. 15 at Mistwood Golf Club, beating Brian Hickey and Ryan Neill 2 and 1, and barely beating a rain squall.
